The 1st Cardigan (St. Mary's) Troop with 40 Scouts was active in September 1912 under S. M. Mr. Thomas F. Baldwin, Empire House, and A. S. Ms. Mr. D. Ladd of Church Street and Mr. L. Jones of Priory Street. However, by the end of 1914 it is probable that both Troops had disappeared. Revival came at the end of the Great War, with the formation of the 3rd Cardigan, and there is evidence that there was also a new lease of life for 1st Cardigan for a surviving registration form from October 1927 for the Cardigan Local Association lists 3rd Cardigan as comprising a Troop of 54-strong under S. M. Mr William J. Portman and 1st Cardigan as a 26-strong Wolf Cub Pack under Cubmistress Miss. M. Evans of the School House, Pendre, Cardigan.

It has been noted already that the town of Cardigan had an early start with its 'Church' and 'Town' Scouts which were the nuclei of the 1st and 2nd Cardigan Groups. These functioned, perhaps sporadically, until 1914. After the First World War, in 1919 (Emlyn Davies et al., 2000, 49) the Cardigan Local Association registered the 3rd Cardigan and this was to become the long-term mainstay of Scouting in the town as the 3rd Cardigan Sea Scout Group, but it was to experience significant breaks in its operation. For instance, it may well have experienced a lull in the early 1920s for a registration form dated October 1927 gives the date of formation of the 3rd Cardigan as May 1923, perhaps indicating a break sometime after the 1919 registration. It had a fragmented life through to the end of the Second World War, but it always seems to have been able to emerge from its dormant phases. On a registration form for March 1954 it was the only Group named for quite a large area "extending 10 miles to the North, 5 miles to the West and 3 miles to the South of the Town of Cardigan and includes the following places: Cardigan, Aberporth, Blaenporth, Tresaith, Rhydlewis, Cilgerran, Llechryd, Llangoedmore, St. Dogmaels". Again, though, it was to lapse. In the 1957 Census there is a note "3rd Cardigan cancelled, must re-register". Yet it was back in operation in 1958 with 10 Scouts, but with only 3 Scouts in 1959. However, its registration was then cancelled, the reason given being "lack of Scouters". It was missing from the Annual Census returns from 1960 to 1965, inclusive, and again had a broken profile after that. It was not until 1973 and onwards that it can be said that it had a continuous presence in the District. From 1989 onwards it ran a full complement of Beavers, Cubs and Scouts and went on to support Ventures. page 44.

 A THIEF IN A DILEMMA. On Monday last, at the borough police-court, information was laid by the

David Meredith Phillips Bevan, Private, 305689, London Regiment. David was born at Portsmouth in 1895, the son of Benjamin and Sarah Bevan. His father was a Customs Officer, from Burry Port, and by 1911 had moved the family to Cardigan, where they lived at 1, Quay Street. David was educated at King's College, London. He was still a student there when war broke out, and he enlisted into the Essex Regiment. He was posted to Egypt, joining the 1/10th Battalion, London Regiment, which was attached to 162 Brigade, 54th (East Anglian) Division. He took part in the Palestinian campaign from 1917 until the end of the war, and returning to civilian life became a Bank Clerk for the National and Provincial Bank, living at 10, Pembrey Road, Llanelli. He died from the effects of the war at Netley, Priory Street, Cardigan on 14 September 1921, aged 25 and was buried at Cardigan Cemetery.

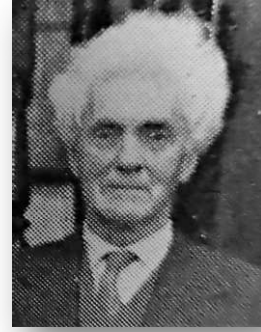

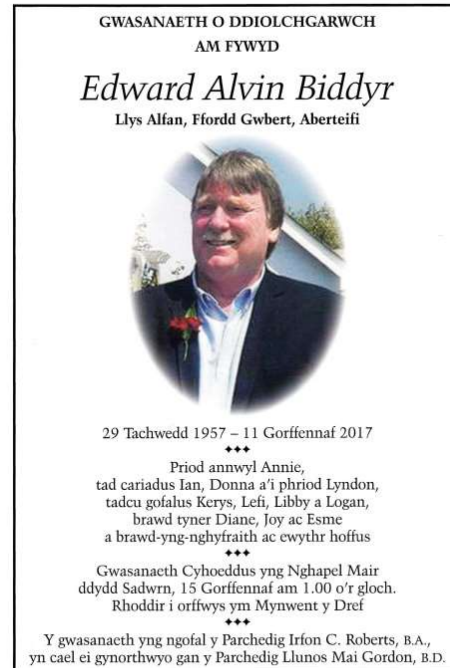

Blake, David Benjamin Private, 33779, Welsh Regiment. David was the son of William and Jane Blake, of Greenfield Row, Cardigan. David enlisted at Llanelli into the 9th Battalion, Welsh Regiment, which was attached to 58 Brigade, 19th (Western) Division. The Division moved to France during July 1915, and moved to positions near Loos, where it took part in the opening attack of the Battle of Loos on 25 September 1915. The following year the Division moved to the Somme, where it took part in the second wave of the attack on Ovillers-La Boisselle on 1 July, capturing the village at heavy cost, and fought at the Battle of Pozières. On 3 August the division began moving to entrain for Bailleul, prior to moving into positions at Rossignol Wood. David was killed in action during a routine spell in the trenches here on 28 August 1916, aged 32. He is buried at Kemmel Chateau Military Cemetery, Belgium. His cousin Richard also fell.

 and Mary Blake, of 12, North Road, Cardigan. Richard enlisted at Brecon in 1917 into the
 South Wales Borderers, and was posted to France, joining the 6th Battalion, South Wales

Borderers, which was the Pioneer Battalion to the 25th Division. He probably joined the battalion after it had taken part in the Battle of Messines Ridge. After fighting at Messines, the Division moved north, and fought at Pilckem, before moving south again, where it took up positions around Bullecourt in reserve. Here the Division was used to reinforce the badly depleted British units that were hit in the area by the German Spring Offensive. It moved north to Flanders on the night of 30 March, and took up positions at Ploegsteert again, where it received reinforcements, and rebuilt. However, on 9 April the Germans launched an offensive on the Lys, and the Division was caught up in the terrible fighting here. Richard was killed in action here on 10 April 1918. He was 19 years old, and is commemorated on the Ploegsteert Memorial, Belgium. His cousin David also fell.

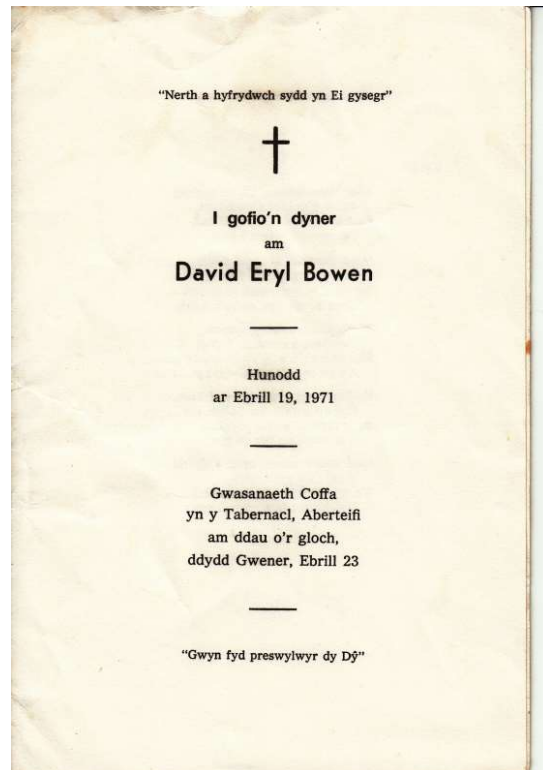

By 1902 Bowen Brothers were operating the Tea Exchange and on 9th November 1906 Mr Evan

Bowen became the Mayor of Cardigan. On 22nd February 1907 bank manager John Nicholas was

charged with forgery and the hasty withdrawal of funds by his former customers resulted in the

closure of the bank. By 26th July that year Bowen Brothers had taken full advantage of the

situation, purchased the property and doubled the size of their shop. By 1914 Evan Bowen was an

Alderman of the Borough. [d. CTA 27.07.1945]

On 16th August 1929 Bowen Brothers sold their business to Star Supply Stores. Star Supply Stores traded here until George Mason took over the building and opened a self-service grocer's store here. In 1971 they moved to Bank House, 6 High Street. Soon afterwards the building became the Tuck In cafe. In 1979 Colin Frederick Hall was the manager. In 1989 Lloyd's Supersave opened a branch of their chemist's business here and the frontage was improved the following year in a more traditional style. The shop was closed in 2000. In December 2001 the property became a branch of "Select", selling ladies' clothing.

He enlisted at cardigan on 14 October 1914 into the 9th Battalion, Welsh Regiment, which was attached to 58 Brigade, 19th (Western) Division. The Division moved to France during July 1915, and moved to positions near Loos, where it took part in the opening attack of the Battle of Loos on 25 September 1915. The Division suffered terrible casualties that day, and remained in the Festubert area to rebuild over the coming winter. George was killed in action here on 4 December 1915, when he was spotted by a German sniper who shot him in the head. He was 28 years old, and is buried at St. Vaast Post Military Cemetery, Richebourg-L'Avoue, France.

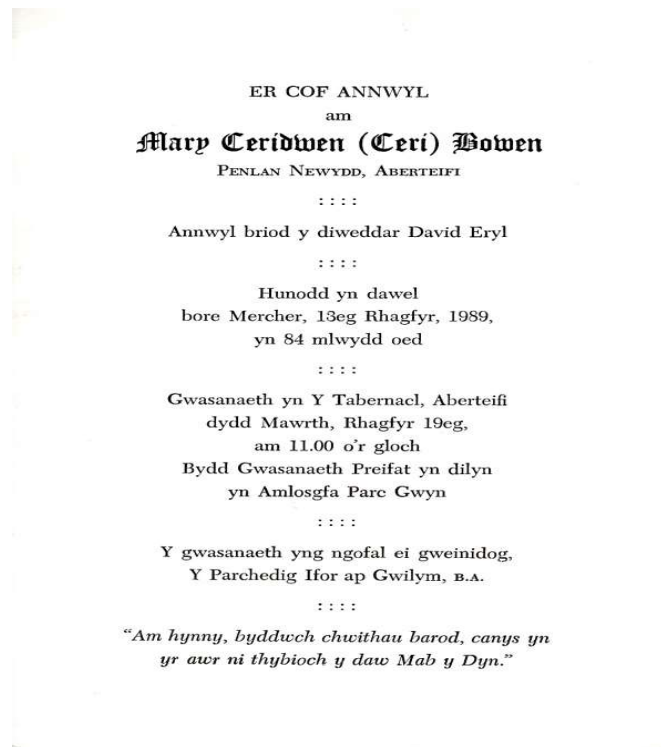

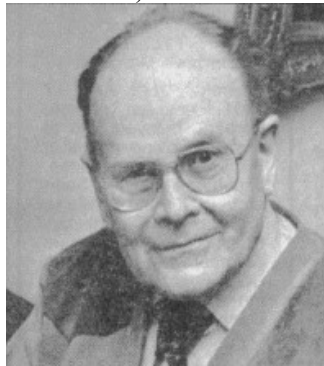

Assistant Steward, 213674, Naval Auxiliary Personnel (Merchant Navy). William was from Cardigan, but had run away from home to go to sea, probably ending up in Dinas. He initially served in the Merchant Navy, before being seconded to the Royal Navy, and served aboard HMS Avenger. Avenger was one of four motor-ships laid down under Maritime Commission contract, by the Sun Shipbuilding & Drydock Co. at Chester, Pennsylvania, and launched on 27 November 1940. In 1942 she was rebuilt from a US merchant ship, as the second of 38 converted C3 escort carriers turned over to Great Britain during the war. She was commissioned as an escort carrier on 2 March 1942 and served with Convoy PQ-18 (sinking one U-boat on the journey), before participating in Operation Torch (the invasion of North Africa). HMS Avenger was sunk by a German submarine as she was heading back from Africa to her home port Clyde on 15 November 1942. The explosion that sank her left only 12 survivors out of a total crew of 550 men. William was one of the men killed that day. He was 19 years old, and is commemorated on the Liverpool Naval Memorial.

Brown, John Gunner, 85323, Machine Gun Corps. John was the son of Mrs. MacCunn, of Sandbank, Ardnadam, Argyle. He worked at Cardiff as a Draper and had served with the Volunteers prior to the war. He married Sydney Kate Williams in Cardiff on 20 September 1914, and the couple had two children. John enlisted at Cardiff on 9 December 1915 into the Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders. On 8 February 1917 he was transferred from the Paisley Depot to the Machine Gun Corps, and was posted to the Middle East, landing in Basra on 9 November and joining the 60th Battalion, Machine Gun Corps, which was attached to the 60th (2/2nd London) Division. The campaign in Mesopotamia was on the wane by now, as the Turks were in full retreat. John was kicked by a horse in February 1918 and sustained two broken ribs. He returned to duty after recovering, and was killed in action on 19 September 1918 aged 36. He is buried in Ramleh War Cemetery, Israel. His widow Sydney Kate Brown, later moved to 5, High Street, Cardigan. **John is commemorated on the memorial at St. Mary's Church, but not on the main cenotaph.**

Bryan, William Oliver George Fourth Engineer Officer, Merchant Navy. William was the son of John and Virginia Bryan. He served with the Merchant Navy aboard the MV Lady Glanely, a Cardiff registered steamer. On 2 December 1940, Lady Glanely was on route from Vancouver via Panama and Bermuda to London carrying a cargo of wheat and timber, when she was torpedoed by the German submarine U-101 and sunk with the loss of 31 men. William was 23 years old when he died aboard her that day, and is commemorated on the Tower Hill Memorial, London.
