

At an early hour on Monday morning, Mr S. Kelly, of the Bridge End Foundry, breathed his last. Mr Kelly, who was much respected, had been a member of the town council for nearly three years, and though he had been complaining for some time, the end came quite unexpectedly. At a meeting of the town council on Monday a vote of condolence with the widow and family was passed, and it was decided that the mayor and corporation, in their official capacity, should attend the funeral.' [1894, S W Daily News]

FUNERAL OF MR. S. F. KELLY. On Thursday afternoon the remains of Mr Kelly, of the Bridge-end Foundry, who died at an early hour on Monday morning, were interred at the Cemetery with military honours. At 2.30 p.m., the cortege, which was exceedingly large, started from Northgate House, Priory-terrace, preceded by the Mayor in robes of office, mace bearers (carrying a wreath) and members of the Corporation, followed by the Clergy and Volunteer Brass Band (playing the Dead March), the volunteers forming a guard of honour each side of the hearse, the officers following then came the mourners and the public. Service having concluded in St. Mary's Church, where the vicar officiated, the cortege reformed and wended their way to the cemetery, where the interment took place, the vicar and curate officiating. Deceased being a lieutenant in the local volunteers, three volleys were fired over the grave after the service was concluded. Numerous beautiful wreaths and crosses were laid on the coffin, which, together with the very large gathering, showed the high esteem in which deceased was held. [16 June 1894 Cardigan Observer]

According to Donald Davies, Scott F. Kelly took over the Foundry in 1870.

On 31st December 1880 Timothy Thomas & Sons, were still the proprietors of the Foundry. On 16th October 1885 new offices and stores were being built here. In 1890 the foundry passed to William E. Matthews. Scott F. Kelly was the engineer here in 1891-94, but died on 11th June 1894, aged 42. He had diversified the foundry into traction engine repairs. William E. Matthews took over the foundry after this date.

ELECTION of 1891

Almost up to the last but little interest was felt in the contest, although some warmth was infused on Saturday, when one of the candidates who had professed not to canvass on principle was found thoroughly at work. The actual fight appeared to be between the following:— Messrs. S. F. Kelly, Bridgend Foundry; Evan Jenkins, grocer; Ivor Evans, solicitor; Captain Davies, Royal Oak; and W. J. Williams, solicitor, for the four seats. Out of nearly 841 voters on the register, not a quarter had polled at two o'clock. After six o'clock at least 2/3 of the voters were polled. There was some excitement at eight o'clock approached. Counting commenced at 8.30 and closed at 9.45. The following were the figures as given by the mayor as the returning officer: Elected S. F. Kelly (Indept Candidate) 344; Ivor Evans (Baptist) 304 Evan Jenkins Ind 309 W. J. Wms (Bapt) 227 apt. Davies not elected 171. The successful candidates were carried round the town in a torchlight procession. The political composition of the council is not altered by the change. [3.11.1891 Western Mail]

Knight, Evan James Private, 49234, South Wales Borderers. Evan was born at Haverfordwest, the son of John and Elizabeth Knight. The family moved to Arthur's Court, Cardigan after John retired from the army. Evan married Caroline Humphreys, of 21, Mwldan, Cardigan in 1918, just after enlisting at Carmarthen into the army.

He was posted to France to join the 10th Battalion, South Wales Borderers, which was attached to 115 Brigade, 38th (Welsh) Division. The 38th Division was in positions north of Albert, where it remained until launching its attack across the River Ancre on 21 August 1918. The Welshmen drove the Germans from Thiepval Ridge and Pozières, and began their offensive towards the mighty Hindenburg Line. Evan was killed at Épehy on 20 September 1918. He was just 19 years old, and is commemorated on the Vis-En-Artois Memorial, France. His widow later remarried, becoming Caroline Davies, of 1, Parade Road, Carmarthen. (The memorial incorrectly shows Thomas Knight, the younger brother).

Knight, John Private, 1990, Welsh Regiment. John was born at Hamilton, Ontario in 1867. He was an army pensioner and resided at Arthur's Court, Cardigan prior to the war, with his wife Elizabeth Knight and their two sons. He re-enlisted at Cardigan into the 2nd Battalion, Welsh Regiment. The battalion moved to France at the outbreak of war, attached to 3 Brigade, 1st Division. The Division had been one of the first to arrive in France, fighting at the Battle of Mons, and taking part in the

retreat to the Marne, where the Germans were stopped. They then fought at the Aisne, and at Chivy, before being moved north to Ypres. Here they fought at the First Battle of Ypres, where they again stopped the German Offensive, before wintering in Flanders. The following year saw them in action again at the Battle of Aubers. John was killed in action here on 30 March 1915, aged 48. He is commemorated on the Le Touret Memorial, Richebourg L'Avoue, France. His son, Evan James Knight also fell.
